- * Appreciated the Rotary Club putting on Front Street Fest

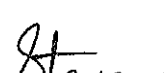
Council Member, Devan Vincent:

Introduced **Resolution 25-28, RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE AMOUNTS AND RATES AS DETERMINED BY THE BUDGET COMMISSION AND AUTHORIZING THE NECESSARY TAX LEVIES AND CERTIFYING THEM TO THE COUNTY AUDITOR.**

A MOTION TO ACCEPT RESOLUTION 25-28 – RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE AMOUNTS AND RATES AS DETERMINED BY THE BUDGET COMMISSION AND AUTHORIZING THE NECESSARY TAX LEVIES AND CERTIFYING THEM TO THE COUNTY AUDITOR, WAS MADE BY DON LARRICK, SECONDED BY HOMER WEEKLEY. ROLL CALL VOTE, ALL YEAS.

RESOLUTION 25-29, A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE AMOUNT OF TAXES THAT MAY BE RAISED BY LEVY AT THE MAXIMUM RATE AUTHORIZED BY LAW WITHOUT A VOTE OF THE PEOPLE INSUFFICIENT AND DECLARING THE NECESSITY FOR A LEVY IN EXCESS OF SUCH RATE.

A MOTION TO ACCEPT RESOLUTION 25-29 - A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE AMOUNT OF TAXES THAT MAY BE RAISED BY LEVY AT THE MAXIMUM RATE AUTHORIZED BY LAW WITHOUT A VOTE OF THE PEOPLE INSUFFICIENT AND DECLARING THE NECESSITY FOR A LEVY IN EXCESS OF SUCH RATE, WAS MADE BY JAMIE WHITE, SECONDED BY DON LARRICK. ROLL CALL VOTE, ALL YEAS.
